Water Permits Division

- State Revolving Fund (SRF)
 - Loan money for WW & DW improvements
- Technical Assistance Unit
 - Support SRF
 - Review wastewater construction
- Livestock Permitting & Compliance Program
 - Review applications for livestock construction & operating permits
 - Review NPDES applications for livestock
- NPDES program
 - Review applications for industrial & municipal wastewater discharge permits
 - Construction & industrial storm water program
- Onsite Program
 - Review applications for onsite systems
 - Manage operator certification program



State Revolving Fund Changes

- Regulations for CWSRF and DWSRF found in Title 131
- Purpose of SRF is to provide low interest loans and grants for:
 - Construction of wastewater treatment facilities
 - Sanitary sewer collection systems
 - Public water supply systems
 - ✓ Non-profit non-community water systems





State Revolving Fund Changes

- LB737 (2016) expanded funding eligibility and maximum term length
 - Acquisition of land
 - ✓ Watershed projects
 - ✓ Security measures for treatment works
 - Max term from 20 to 30 years (depending upon useful life)
- Propose updates to Title 131 at June EQC hearing



State Revolving Fund Changes

- 2018 Intended Use Plan
 - NDEQ & NDHHS plan to allocate funds
- What's New for 2018?



- Small town grant eligibility requirements modified to allow more towns the opportunity to utilize the grant
 - Reduced debt service payment requirement
 - Reduced loan payment per month per household requirement
- Included interest rates & terms for loans > 20 years
- Linked Deposit Program
 - Incorporated into Title 131 in November 2016
 - Seeking financial institution partners to provide low-cost loans for eligible non-point source projects



Livestock Permitting Updates

- Title 130 outlines requirements for when a Livestock Waste Control Facility is required to obtain a permit
 - Initial inspection
 - ✓ Controls required
 - Construction & Operating Permit application
 - Certification of Construction Complete
 - ✓ NPDES, if required



Livestock Permitting Updates

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- In February/March 2017, Livestock permitting program underwent a process improvement
 - Map out current process
 - Identify and reduce areas of redundancy
 - Assure staff understood their roles in process

Outcomes

- Improvements to internal checklists
- Need to reduce/eliminate application addendums
- Development of online application system



Livestock Permitting Updates

- Online Application System
 - Standardize application submittals
 - Assure applications are administratively complete
 - ✓ Reduce paper copies needed
 - ✓ Assure fees are paid at the time of application
- Goal: Early Summer Release



NPDES Updates

- An NPDES permit is required if a facility discharges into any waters of the state. (Ch 2)
- Types of permits available from NDEQ pursuant to Title 119, include:
 - Direct Discharge
 - Construction Stormwater
 - Industrial Stormwater





NPDES Updates

- Permit Types (continued):
 - Dewatering
 - ✓ Hydrostatic Testing
 - ✓ Pretreatment
 - Land Application Domestic Wastewater (Ch 12)
 - ✓ Land Application Industrial Wastewater



NPDES Updates

- Title 119 updates adopted at November 2016 EQC hearing
 - Federal Pretreatment streamlining measures
 - Federal Revisions to Construction Stormwater Effluent Limitation Guidelines
 - Federal Revisions to Requirements for Cooling Water Intake Structures
 - Allow for Electronic Submittal of Permit Applications
 - Clarify Effluent Sampling Requirements
 - Replace References to 1990 Census
 - Inclusion of LLCs as a Recognized Business Organization
- Approved by Attorney General's Office
- Review by Governor's Office next



NPDES Updates

- On April 13, EPA announced decision to review and reconsider Effluent Limitation Guidelines for Steam Electric Power Generating Units
 - Issued an administrative stay to delay compliance deadlines
 - NDEQ will be working with affected sources on path forward
 - In September 2015, EPA finalized the NPDES electronic reporting rule, which requires electronic submission of:
 - Discharge monitoring reports
 - Notices of Intent to discharge in compliance with a general permit; and
 - ✓ Program reports



NPDES Updates

- As of May 2017, 338 of the 628 sources have registered and begun reporting DMRs electronically via NetDMR
- On May 22nd 2017 NetDMR user accounts were migrated with EPA's CDX accounts
 - Provides one login for multiple systems: Net, Lead, SSTS, NetDMR
 - Allows users to submit subscriber agreements electronically



NPDES Updates

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General Permits Under Development

- Single Pass Cooling Water drafted, being revised
- Livestock Truck Wash pre-draft outline
- Lake Alum Treatment under review

Industrial Stormwater Permit

- Backlog Notices of Intent still being processed
 - Call NPDES to get an update (Jason Windhorst)
